Who was St. David?


St. David is the Christian Patron Saint of Wales, who was born in the year 500 (approx), the alleged grandson of Ceredig ap Cunedda, King of Ceredigion - ruler of one of the several Welsh kingdoms that emerged in post-Roman Britain in the mid-5th century, located within now modern region of Ceredigion, on the west coast of Wales.

A notoriously difficult place to invade by land due to its hilly geography and by sea due to its large coastline along the often-choppy Cardigan Bay

According to legend, his mother St. Non (another Christian Saint) gave birth to him on a Pembrokeshire clifftop during a fierce storm.

The spot is marked by the ruins of Non's Chapel, and a nearby holy well is said to have healing powers with his symbol was that of a White Dove.

St. David became renowned as a teacher and Christian preacher during his life, founding monastic settlements and churches in Wales, Dumnonia (Devon / Cornwall), and Brittany (France), famous for his supposed miracles performed - including (whilst preaching the word of God in a small village) the very ground around him raised up becoming a small hill, elevating his position for his words of worship to be heard across the whole village.



Regardless of what legends are true or not St. David remains a symbol of national pride for the people of Wales, with him being considered the only native born patron saint of Britain and Northern Ireland.
